

Canine vaccinations

What are vaccinations?

Vaccines are biological products injected under your pet's skin. The vaccine **stimulates an immune response** and prepares your pet to fight future infections from disease causing agents. When vaccinated, your dog's immune system will recognize the virus or bacteria next time he/she is exposed and eliminate it. **Proper vaccination is the only way to prevent your pet from developing potentially fatal diseases.**

Immunity does take time to develop, therefore a vaccination regime must be followed.



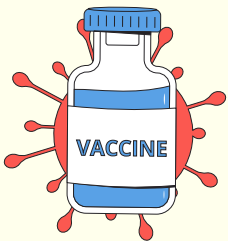
Is it important to vaccinate?

Yes!

Vaccinations protect your pet from potentially deadly infections like distemper and parvovirus.

Treatment against these diseases is expensive and often unsuccessful. Protection declines over time and re-vaccination annually is advised to ensure ongoing and strong immunity

This also allows you to maintain regular annual health checks making you pro-active



What do we vaccinate against?

- Canine Parvo Virus
- Canine Hepatitis
- Distemper
- Parainfluenza
- Rabies
- Kennel Cough (if visiting a kennel) & Canine Corona

Vaccination Protocol

1st: 6 weeks (5-in-1)

2nd: 9 weeks • 5-in-1

3rd: 12 weeks • 5-in-1 and Rabies

4th: 16 weeks • 5-in-1 and Rabies

Annual: • 5-in-1 and Rabies & Kennel Cough (if going to stay in a kennel)

Can they get a negative reaction to the vaccines?

Yes, but allergic reactions are rare and usually presents within half an hour of the vaccination. The most common reaction is swelling of the face. If this happens, please take your dog back to your vet as soon as possible.
