



# Feline vaccinations

## What are vaccinations?

Vaccines are biological products that **activate protective immune responses** and prepare your pet to fight future infections from disease causing agents.

When vaccinated, your cat's immune system will recognize the invasion of the virus or bacteria and eliminate it.



## Is it important to vaccinate?

Yes!

**Vaccinations protect your cat from debilitating infections.**

Protection declines over time and re-vaccination annually is advised to ensure ongoing and strong immunity

This also allows you to maintain regular annual health checks, making you pro-active.

## What do we vaccinate against?

- Feline viral Rhinotracheitis (Feline herpesvirus-1)
- Feline Calicivirus (cause respiratory disease)
- Feline panleukopenia
- Feline chlamydiosis
- Rabies
- Bordetella Bronchiseptica if staying at a cattery

## Vaccination Protocol

**1st:** 9 weeks (4-in-1)

**2nd:** 12 weeks 4-in-1 and Rabies

**3rd:** 16 weeks 4-in-1 and Rabies

**Annual Booster** 4-in-1 and Rabies & BB Intranasal (if going to stay in a cattery)

## Can they get a negative reaction to the vaccines?

Yes, but it is rare and usually presents within half an hour of the vaccination. The most common reaction is swelling of the face. If this happens please take your cat back to your vet as soon as possible.
